- 2. Increase awareness of seagrass issues by establishing public and scientific initiatives, including support for the organization of future Mediterranean Seagrass Workshop and other local meetings;
- 3. Set up and maintain a web page for literature, data & information exchange;
- 4. Enhance conservation, monitoring and educational issues linked to Mediterranean seagrass ecosystems.

Even if we are thinking that conservation is the main and most efficient tool to manage *Posidonia oceanica* meadows, we are conscious that in some specific case, reforestation could be useful. For this reason, an independant assessment of case studies concerning the transplantation or reinforcement of Posidonia meadows appear necessary and we will support the "SEPOSSO" LIFE project in order to increase awareness and knowledge about the project main topics, enhancing its visibility at Mediterranean scale through promotion and diffusion of activities and results, in order to increase communication and to promote comparison network across different countries on this specific issue, within our scientific activities and our meetings during and after the lifespan of the SEPOSSO project.
